Nr. 2: Lewis and Ashling

MUSTERLÖSUNG

a) Lewis calls Ashling a vampire because her black hair, black clothes and very white face remind him of pictures of vampires he has seen in films and books.

b) Ashling has to help her mother with the guests, probably because her dad died. She has arguments with her mother, which never happened when her dad was still alive.

c) likes: She likes riding Raven down to the beach, listening to music, the horses generally, writing in her diary, people/guests who know how to ride a horse.

dislikes: She dislikes that she has to go on a horse ride with her mother and the guests, that she has to be friendly to the guests, that she can't do anything she wants like listen to music, that the people in the Burren stare at her, that the guests don't know how to ride.

d) To her they sound funny, not like people from Dublin or other parts of the south of Ireland. She thinks they are from Northern Ireland. She thinks that the boy talks more than he writes, that he is probably playing games on his computer or chatting with his friends. She hopes that he won't talk too much the next day on the ride.
