SOLUTIONS

Section 4

- 1 **Hopes:** that we will be safe; that my baby will have a better life and future than we did in Myanmar; that we will be able to leave the camp soon.
Fears: that my baby will get sick in the camp; that we made a mistake by leaving Myanmar; that we will have to stay in the camp for a very long time; that nobody will help us and take care of us.
- 2 **Their relationship** is not very good, and there is a lot of tension. Cooper's dad wants to spend more time with him, and Cooper knows he is "trying to be friendly" and that he wants to "avoid an argument." But Cooper can't spend time with his dad now. He is used to lying to his dad – he has "years of experience." It's clear their relationship is bad when Mr Jackson says, "you and I haven't been getting along too well recently", and Cooper says, "I couldn't remember the last time he touched me."

I think the charity made this video to make people in the UK think about children who are in danger, even if they don't know the children or don't know what it's like to live in an unsafe country.
