2. „The people and the issues“(p. 44)

a) About 15 lines (180 words)

Zoe and Jacob are sister and brother. Since Zoe decided to become vegetarian, the two have been arguing about eating habits the whole time. Zoe seems to be the smarter and more sensible one of the two: she has some good arguments for why her brother shouldn’t eat meat anymore. Jacob, on the other hand, doesn’t have good arguments for eating meat and can’t use this language as well as Zoe can. He seems to want to provoke her by telling her to be quiet or holding a piece of meat in front of her face. It is impossible even for the parents to keep the family peace. So, at the moment there is a lot of tension and conflict in the relationship between Zoe and Jacob, probably because they are teenagers. They both have very clear opinions and want to show the other person that they are right. They know each other very well because they are sister and brother, which is also why they fight and argue so much.

b) Arguments from the text

for eating meat	against eating meat
- meats tastes good	- killing animals is murder, they have a right to live too(meat is murder)
- vegetarians don’t get enough protein	- vast areas of the rainforest are being destroyed to grow food for animals
- infamous people (Hitler) were/are vegetarians	- food should be grown for starving people, nor for the meat industry
	- many famous people were/are vegetarians (Leonardo da Vinci, Ghandi, Beyoncé ...)

Today, we continue with the meaning of *ought to*. Have a close look at the following lines from the text 1: „You ought to stop eating meat. So many people are hungry. We ought to grow food for them, not for animals“.
